## From Little Acorns.....



We hope you will already have watched the video of Arise School. Many of you have supported the charity since 2013 when the first classroom opened with just one teacher and eleven children. Today, Arise Pre and Primary Community School has over 30 staff, ten classrooms, 400 pupils, Science and Computer Rooms and a staff room. The kitchen has recently been renovated and upgraded to make it environmentally friendly and a Dining Room is under construction.

The school is working towards becoming self-sustaining. Over the years, ACE has also funded the installation of a well and irrigation system, electricity and solar power and various animal husbandry, farming and fishing projects. In order to bring in income, ten houses for rent have also been built on land adjacent to the school.



It is you, our supporters, who have made all of this possible. In 2012, when Frank, now the School Director, first showed us the family land on which he wanted to realise his dream to build a school open to any child in the local community, our aim was just to try and raise enough to build one classroom!

We hope the video gives a small insight into Arise School and the education it affords so many children who would not otherwise have that opportunity. If you wonder why some of the pupils are wearing a hat in the tropics, the school is over 1,000 metres up Mt. Kilimanjaro. Hats and jumpers are the norm at certain times of the year!

# ACE Christmas Appeal 2025

Arise School was set up with the underlying philosophy that it should be so much more than a school. Whilst seeking to provide quality education, it also takes a wholistic view of children's needs, nurturing and providing opportunities for extra-curricular activities that, given the poverty of their home circumstances, many of them would never be able to experience.



In addition, sport, both team and individual, is very much part of the life blood of Arise School. For so many, it is a critical part of their learning and personal development. Donations will also go towards replenishing basic items, such as footballs, netballs, nets and athletics equipment.

Currently, arrangements are underway to set up an online Chess Group. With his father's support, the tutor will be a 12 year old chess champion. Having had the opportunity himself, he now wishes to use his skills to benefit other young people. Donations from this year's Christmas Appeal will be used to purchase chess boards and clocks. It is also planned to extend this to other traditional board games to the benefit of students more widely.



## ***Lastly, supporting local families.....***

In 2024, a successful pilot community project was initiated whereby ACE provided funding for six of the poorest families to rent an acre of land for 12 months. The aim was for them to grow maize to feed their own family and sell any surplus to bring in income for the family, including to cover the ongoing cost of the land rent. This year, the project was extended to a further 12 families. Once again, the results of the recent harvest demonstrate the benefits of the project.



We hope to be able to extend this opportunity to more families in 2026. The cost of renting an acre of land, providing seeds and the necessary farming equipment is £150 per family. Any donations towards this would also be greatly appreciated.

## **Arise School Grade 7 Results 2025**

**This year's Grade 7 results are now in. We are delighted to say that, once again, all 35 students at Arise have done exceptionally well. Students are required to sit six national exams for which they receive an individual grade. They are also awarded an overall, average grade.**

**Amazingly, 32 students received Grade A average and three Grade B!**

**All students received Grade A in three subjects - English, Science and Civic and Moral Education!**

**Arise School was graded as “Excellent” overall in four subjects English, Kiswahili, Science and Civic and Moral Education!**

**At the outset, our shared aim with Arise was that the school should provide “quality” education. We never dreamed it would be on quite such a journey towards excellence!**

**Our very warmest congratulations go to the students and all the Arise School staff who, from the earliest years, work together to provide a nurturing and supportive environment in which every student is able to thrive, learn and enjoy their education, irrespective of their family background and circumstances.**
